Day 1 Home - Seattle (Optional Morning Tour / Night Tour)

Destination:

- We will offer free airport pick-up service during 9:00AM-10:00PM. Please wait for our tour guide at number 1 Baggage Claim area, and then guests will be taken to the hotel to catch a rest. Guests are able to arrange the rest of day by their own or join our optional Morning Tour or Night Tour. (*To arrange the tour, it requires at least 4 guests enrolled.)
- (Morning tour: Flight arrivals before 12:00PM) Microsoft Corporate Headquarters University of Washington
- Founded in 1975, Microsoft is the worldwide leader in software, services, devices and solutions that help people and businesses realize their full potential. It should also be reminded that the campus is famous for appreciating Cherry blossom.
- (Night tour: Flight arrivals before 6:00PM) Seattle Fisherman Wharf 、Kerry Park、Starbucks Reserve Roastery and Tasting Room
- We will firstly travel to Seattle Great Wheel, which is a giant Ferris wheel at Pier 57 on Elliott Bay in Seattle, Washington. With an overall height of 175 feet, it was the tallest Ferris wheel on the West Coast of the United States when it opened on June 29, 2012. Next stop is Kerry Park where visitors can have a panoramic city view of the entire Seattle. It is a perfect location for photography and if you see Space Needle with a backdrop of Mount Rainier in any marketing photos of Seattle, this is exactly where to take the pictures. In addition, the park was one of the many stops on the finale episode of the third season of Amazing Race. At the same time, we will visit Starbucks Reserve Roastery and Tasting Room. It is more like a modern coffee factory. You will witness the machines roasting the freshest coffee beans and grinding the most concentrated coffee powder. You can also open your mind up, order a cup of the most creative coffee, or enjoy the latest Starbucks products. Here you can also see the whole process of unsealing and baking the original coffee beans.

Mt. Rainier National Park

Mt. Rainier is the tallest volcano of the Continental United States, the 5th tallest mountain of the entire US territory. The mountain top is covered by snow all year round. When snow melts, snow water flows down in a large volume, which creates beautiful waterfalls and vast lakes meanwhile irrigates the forest land. Mount Rainier is circled by the 93-mile-long Wonderland Trail and is covered by several glaciers and snowfields totaling some 35 square miles. Carbon Glacier is the largest glacier by volume in the contiguous United States, while Emmons Glacier is the largest glacier by area. About 1.8 million people visit Mount Rainier National Park each year. Mount Rainier is a popular peak for mountaineering with some 10,000 attempts per year with approximately 50% making it to the summit. We will go along the Wonderland Trail by stopping at 1-2 scenic spots. (According to the situation of the day). In the summer, we will lead you traverse the Volcano mountains.

o OR. Olympic National Park

Olympic National Park is a national park located in the Olympic Peninsula, WA. The park consists of four regions: the Pacific coastline, alpine areas, the west side temperate rainforest and the forests of the drier east side. With nearly one million acres, Olympic national park encompasses several distinctly different ecosystems and protects a rich mosaic of natural and cultural history. It protects 73 miles of wild Pacific coast. Tide pools, sandy beaches and rocky cliffs can all be found here. At the center of the peninsula are the majestic glacier capped Olympic Mountains. Hurricane Ridge, over a mile high, offers spectacular views of mountains, wildflowers, deer, black bear, and other wildlife. (If we can't drive to the Hurricane due to the bad weather, we will go to the other attractions in Olympic National Park.) The 10-acre natural lake, Lake Crescent, located at an elevation of 600 feet is a pristine area that provides visitors with an extraordinary place for recreation and relaxation. Only a few places of interest allow the automobiles to enter the natural beauty. There is a wealth of outdoor activities with over 900 miles of trails traversing the vast interior of the recognized wildness. When going back to Seattle, you can take the Bainbridge Island ferry to enjoy the

- breathtaking views of Seattle's coastline.
- o atmosphere can be found everywhere all year round. Enjoy shopping of delicate European souvenirs and taste the authentic German food and beer, or try on some traditional German costume clothes.

Day 3 Seattle City Tour - Fairbanks (Airport Code: FAI)

Seattle is the largest city in both the State of Washington and Pacific Northwest region of North America and the fastest growing major city in the US. Here, we will bring you to Boeing factory, the largest aircraft manufacture in the world. At its factory you will learn the history of aircraft making and also see one of the only 4 Dream lifters in the world; there will be professional Boeing employee guiding you to see the assembling process of the Boeing 7-series. Boeing can build a miracle in only 3 days, so get prepared to open your eyes, there will be experiences that you never had before. Next, we will go to Pike Place Market, which is built in a hundred years ago. The Pike Place Market was originated by farmers for selling their products, it is now one of the major tour spots in Seattle, holds about 200 commercial events every year, exhibits 190 kinds of handcrafts, includes 120 agriculture venders and plus street performers. Pike Place Market is also where the first Starbucks store was founded. After strolling around the market, we will head to Space Needle (Outside View). Chihuly Garden and Glass is an exhibit in the Seattle Center showcasing the studio glass of Dale Chihuly. The project includes three primary components: The Garden, the Glasshouse, and the Interior Exhibits, All the exhibitions are so fascinating and breathtaking. It is definitely worth to visit. The MoPOP is founded by Microsoft cofounder Paul Allen and designed by Avant grade designer Frank Gehry, located at the foot of the Space Needle. Its colorful appearance is made up by 3000 pieces of metal means to present. In the end, we will visit the Pioneer Square (Pass by). The Pioneer Square-Skid Road Historic District is listed on the United States' National Register of Historic Places. We will visit Sky View Observatory at Columbia Center, it is one of Seattle's new landmarks and most popular Observatories. Take the elevator to the sightseeing floor and enjoy a 360-degree panoramic view of downtown Seattle: the Ferris Wheel, Puget Sound, Space Needle, Microsoft, Mt. Rainier and more. You can also experience the world's most advanced 360-degree full-screen tower elevator experience: full-screen around, upwards it tells the Mt. Rainier, and downwards it tells you about the establishment of the city in Seattle, where you'll find the perfect panorama to begin your Seattle experience.

It became a legend through the hit TV show "Ice Road Truckers" on the History Channel. More chances to see wildlife, such as caribou, arctic fox, wolf, moose etc.
- o Yukon River—Traverse the mighty Yukon River.
- Trans-Alaska Pipeline—View the remarkable Trans-Alaska Pipeline, one of the world's longest continuous pipeline systems which more than 800-miles in length. It moves 500,000 barrels of crude oil a day.
- o Arctic Circle—Cross the Arctic Circle and receive an official Arctic Circle Adventure Certificate.
- Chance to chase Aurora on the way back to Fairbanks. (Night two, fee is included.)
- 🖶 Arctic Circle Aurora Fly Drive Adventure upgrade (Afternoon departure, English-speaking tour guide.)
 - Take a flight to Coldfoot at 1:00 pm. Depart from hotel around 11:30 am. See the endless beautiful tundra and bird-eye view of the vast Arctic Circle. The flight will take 1 hour to 1.5 hour.
 - Mail postcards to your family and friends in the northernmost post office in America or get your precious stamp in the National Park.

 - Take a flight to Coldfoot at 9:00 am. Depart from hotel around 7:30 am. See the endless beautiful tundra and bird-eye view of the vast Arctic Circle. The flight will take 1 hour to 1.5 hour.
 - Mail postcards to your family and friends in the northernmost post office in America or get your precious stamp in the National Park.
 - o Brooks Range Safari--Leave the Coldfoot, head north along the Dalton Highway, deep into the polar region

and head towards the northernmost Brooks Mountains in North America. The Gate of Arctic National Park is on the west side of the Dalton Highway, the northernmost national park in the United States and one of the most difficult-to-reach national parks. This vast area is home to tens of thousands of caribou. As winter approaches, thousands of caribou will migrate southward in groups and come to food court hundreds of kilometers away. If fortunate enough, the tourists can witness the wonder of the world - the caribou migration. We will drive straight to the end of our trip - Sukakpak Mountain. "Sukakpak" is the Eskimo language, meaning "catching clips". It is also called the "magnet" by the residents of Wiseman Town. It is said that in the night when the Aurora is weak and when you can't see it even in Wiseman, the fascinating Northern Lights will still erupt above the Sukakpak Mountain. On your way back, you will come to Wiseman, the only village along the Dalton Road. The village was built in 1908, and the current resident population is only 14. The residents live a leisure life of self-sufficiency and by hunting and growing vegetables.

- o Ground tour south from Coldfoot to Fairbanks. Chance to chase Aurora on the way.
- If the project is unable to travel due to weather conditions, the upgrade fee will be refunded, and you will be scheduled to attend the "Arctic Circle Aurora Drive Adventure".

Day 5 Fairbanks City Tour - Chena Hot Springs Aurora Viewing Tour

- The UAF Museum of The North --The University of Alaska Museum of the North is a vital component of the University of Alaska Fairbanks and the only research and teaching museum in Alaska. Explore Alaska Native cultures, natural wonders, and diverse wildlife, and experience 2,000 years of Alaska art. (You will take a tour of Morris Thompson Cultural & Visitor Center if UAF Museum of the North is closed. And get refund USD12 per person.)
- Santa Claus House--It's Christmas year-round in the North Pole, Alaska—just 20 minutes away from Fairbanks. It has the world's largest Santa statue. You can choose holiday gifts for your special friends, or you can mail a postcard to them. (You will take a tour of North Pole Village if Santa Clause House is closed.)
- Chena Hot Springs Aurora Viewing-- Depart from the hotel around 5:30 pm, enjoy the warmth of these natural Hot Springs in winter. Chance to visit the world's only all-year around open Ice Museum (at your own expense) made of 1,000 tons of ice. It will be a memorable experience to see the creative things that are being carved out of ice! You can order an apple martini that comes in an ice molded martini glass (at your own

expense, at least 21 years old). As daylight wanes, you can watch the northern lights while enjoying the hot springs! Back to Fairbanks hotel around 2:00 am the next morning. (Night three, fee is included.) (If you are not convenient to enjoy the hot springs due to physical sick, the tour guide will help to change your hot spring ticket to Ice Museum ticket which has the equal value.)

You could enjoy a free morning before Fairbanks City Tour. Optional tour: Dog Sled Tour.

♣ Dog Sled Tour (This tour would take approximately 2 hours, Pick-up and drop-off at the specified hotels.)

- Depart at around 10:30 am from hotel, then an Alaskan resident Leslie, will take you **experience dog sledding** and introduce you the dog sledding culture. Leslie came to the Alaska from twenty years ago, started from 2 Alaskan Malamutes and has grown into 50 dogs and a dogsledding cultural exhibition center now. As the annual dog sled race in Alaska becomes so popular all over the world, Leslie opens a training ground for the sled dogs and trains young mushers. She also provides dog sled adventures for the tourists and the income is to prepare for various International dog sled races. She is honored very much by the local community for supporting young mushers and helping them raise funds. In Leslie's dog sledding cultural exhibition center, it uses pictures, audios and physical objects to show visitors how an Alaskan native use the dog sled as a traditional commuting tool and its profound cultural traditions. You will also have a chance to play with the cute dogs.
- o In winter (approximately from November 16th to the beginning of April, the specific date will be adjusted according to the local weather and temperature) you will experience the thrill of the dog sledding over the snow for about 20 to 25 minutes. Two passengers will sit on one sled that is being pulled by a team of dogs. The leading dogs are responsible for the direction and the dog near the seat is the most powerful. You will be speeding on the trail through the forest, splashing snowflakes and have lots of fun.
- In autumn when there is insufficient snowfall (approximately from September 16th to November 15th, the specific date will be adjusted according to the local weather and temperature), the musher will let the dog team pull a ATV instead of a sled for about 5 to 10 minutes. Usually the mommy dog will breed in early fall, so you may have chance to play and take pictures with the newborn puppy! Leslie will also take you to the kennel and explain the history, breeding and training of the dogsledding in Alaska. And you will have a chance to sled first-hand with the musher and enjoy the cooperation and the team work spirit of the sled dog team.

- Denali National Park—The most famous national park that around mountain Denali. The mountains are not covered by forests, and the breathtaking natural beauty attracts visitors from all over the world. You will visit the Visitor Center here, there is a small museum inside, you could watch a movie "cardiac Denali" (about 20 minutes) to aquatint the scenery landscape, wild animals, even season alternation. In the winter, the Denali National Park will be covered by thick snow. With a fine weather and appropriate snowfall, you can enter the national park with a certified guide who has passed the official training. A short walking experience or an

- outdoor snowshoe walk will give you a closer look at North America's first peak.
- Alaska Railroad— Continue your aurora adventure by Aurora Winter Train. Depart at 3:55 pm from Denali
 and arrive at Fairbanks at 8:00 pm. The Alaska Railroad was built at the era of the "Gold Rush", more than
 100 years ago. Along the way, the train travels through some of the most scenic and rugged territory in Alaska.
- If you want to experience another aurora night, we recommend you Optional tour: Aurora Viewing Lodge.
- ♣ Aurora Viewing Lodge (This tour would take approximately 4 hours, Pick-up and drop-off at the specified hotel.)
 - Take our shuttle to the selected aurora viewing lodge, Aurora Viewing Bar or Clear Summit Aurora Viewing Lodge, to experience the mysterious aurora at 10:00 pm. Back to the hotel at around 2:00 am next morning.

 - o An Alaskan resident Somkey will take you on your Alaska Snow Machine Tour! There is nothing like the thrill of driving the snow machine on your own. It is the fastest commuting tool on the snow, and its speed is comparable to a regular vehicle. The snow machine is different from the motorcycle because it is not driven by wheels but by the track rotation. Therefore, you will find the driving safer, more stable and easy to learn. You can ride it up to the hills, cross the obstacles and speed through the open field. You do not need any license to operate the snow machine! Come on and enjoy a scenic route with lots of fresh snow and experience the paradise on earth. (Please bring you winter gear such as waterproof suits, hat, gloves and warm boots to avoid frostbite.)
- - All rivers are frozen in Alaska from the end of November to March next year. The depth of the ice is up to 2m. The fish are very hungry under the ice and can often be readily caught even by people with little fishing experience (LMAO) The fishing guide Don will guide you to catch the trout and salmon! The Fishing equipment, clothes, transportation from the hotel are included.
 - Fishing License--The tour guide will assist you to buy a fishing license (\$25/person at your own expense) on the tour day.
- Aurora Viewing Lodge (This tour would take approximately 4 hours, Pick-up and drop-off at the specified hotel.)
 - Take our shuttle to the selected aurora viewing lodge, Aurora Viewing Bar or Clear Summit Aurora Viewing Lodge, to experience the mysterious aurora at 10:00 pm. Back to the hotel at around 2:00 am next morning.
