Itinerary

Day 1: Home – Washington, D.C.

The first day itinerary is for your reference only; the schedule is subject to change upon your arrival. Thanks for choosing your vacation with us! Arriving at Dulles International Airport (IAD), our tour guide will meet you at the Baggage Claim area. Take our shuttle to the hotel and catch some rest. Complimentary group airport pick-up service is provided 9:00AM - 10:00PM. For the other time, paid pick-up service is also available for the first two persons at \$120 with \$10 for each additional person. For those who arrive before 5:00PM, you are invited to join our Washington Night Tour at \$25/person. . (*Night tour requires at least 4 guests enrolled.)

*Washington Night Tour:

When the night falls, Washington turns into a different city. See all the major sights and monuments of Washington DC lit up for the night on this comprehensive tour of the nation’s capital. With enjoyment of the tranquility, our tour will include the Air Force Memorial where you can easily overlook the Pentagon

and the skyline of the capitol city, the waterside of Reflecting Pool where you can look up at the gorgeous U.S. Capitol building and National Mall (also known as Capitol Hill), the columned rotunda of Jefferson Memorial and the WWII Memorial where you can also oversee the grand Lincoln Memorial.

Day 2: Washington, D.C. – Philadelphia

We will head to Washington D.C. in the morning and firstly visit National Mall (also known as the Capitol Hill), which is between the Lincoln Memorial and the United States Capitol. The National Mall sees millions of visitors and protestors every year, but it has also played as host to many history-making events. We will visit the Lincoln Memorial. This grand monument overlooks the Reflecting Pool, the Washington Monument and the U.S. Capitol. Inside, the 19-foot marble statue of the 16th president is flanked by inscriptions of his Second Inaugural Address and the famous Gettysburg Address. Our tour will also stop at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial and the Korean War Memorial. The two monuments honor members of the U.S. armed forces who fought in the wars. In the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum, we will take a glance at the human aviation and space heritage as well as have a vision of space travel in the future through thousands of objects on display, including the 1903 Wright Flyer, Charles Lindbergh's Spirit of St. Louis, the Apollo 11 Command Module Columbia, and a lunar rock you can touch. Furthermore, we can take photos with backdrops of the White House and the U.S. Capitol due to the visit limitation for the public. Along the way, you will also see and pass by the Thomas Jefferson Memorial, WWII Memorial and more.

Next, we will visit Philadelphia where known as the birthplace of American democracy. At the Independence National Historical Park, tour guide will arrange a free time for guests to walk around. Inside the Independence Hall, you will have a special moment of standing exactly where the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution were signed. You also won't miss the Liberty Bell which is recognized for its famous crack. Go beyond the iconic crack to learn how this State House bell was transformed into an extraordinary symbol. You will also see the Statue of Washington, Congress Hall, and many other great attractions.

Day 3: New York City Tour

At a first glance, travelling around the entire of New York City seems like the mission impossible; however, our highly organized tour is especially designed for you: by visiting amounts of famous landmarks, you will learn more of the city's unique history, culture, and the core spirit of the New Yorkers! By stepping up to the Empire State Building Observation deck, guests could overlook the panoramic view of the central park and New York City. Empire State Building stood as the world's tallest building for nearly 40 years, and has been surpassed in late 1970. Its name is derived from the nickname of New York, the Empire State. Nowadays it is still the most famed landmark of the city. Also, Guests will take a sightseeing cruise tour on the Hudson River to enjoy the city view from a totally different angle, as well as take pictures with the backdrops of Statue of Liberty and Brooklyn Bridge. Furthermore, we will visit USS Intrepid, the legendary aircraft carrier and national heritage that costs \$120 million,

which is reopen for visitors. Concorde supersonic airliner, the space shuttle Enterprise, the world's fastest jets and a guided missile submarine will be also featured in the exhibition. In addition, wandering around the world's famous financial and securities trading center – Wall Street, taking pictures with Trinity Church, New York Stock Exchange and its signature sculpture Charging Bull, and visiting Times Square, Madame Tussauds' - all of these will be made into our tour later. Of course, we can't miss the renowned Metropolitan Museum of Art. The Metropolitan Museum of Art is the largest art museum in the United States with collections of more than 2 million works of art. In the end of the day, our tour bus will pass by the Fifth Avenue, Rockefeller Center, Ground Zero and the new "Freedom tower" - One World Trade Center ...

Hotel: Sheraton Stamford/Hilton Stamford/Holiday Inn Stamford or equivalent

Day 4: Yale University – Boston

Guests will visit the campus of Yale University located in New Haven in the morning. It is the third oldest college with Gothic buildings and student dormitory. You will enjoy a brief stop at the famous Sterling Memorial Library, which was designed by James Gamble Rogers as the centerpiece of Yale's Gothic Revival campus. **(In case of tour areas closed due to school's schedule, campus tour will only take place in the public open area.)**

In the afternoon, upon arrival in Boston, you will have the opportunity of enjoying Boston's most famous Lobster feast. Later we will go to the city of Cambridge, MA where we will visit the Harvard University. Here, you will find Harvard's oldest campus and take pictures with the statue of John Harvard, known as the "Statue of Three Lies". Also, we will have a chance to take pictures with the backdrop of MIT's main buildings. Another fun will begin as soon as you board the cruise ship and enjoy a breathtaking view of the Boston harbor. Later, go sightseeing in the Boston city. We will pass by the old Trinity Cathedral, the Hancock Building, the Boston Park, Prudential Center, and Boston Public Library along the way while overlooking the gold dome of the State House. Upon completion of the tour, we will send you to Boston Logan International Airport for flights home. See "Departure and Return Details" for more details.
