Day 1: Chicago – Galena – Amish Village

We will depart from Chicago to Galena in the morning. You would probably think that the Galena's time freezes if without the retail sale of modern merchandises. Six main streets of Galena have different architectural styles, including architectural styles from French Colonial Period to Greek Revival Period. Day 2: Mill City Museum - Mall of America

We will depart from hotel to **Minneapolis**, another big city that we are going to visit in Midwestern U.S. beside Chicago. Here, we will visit the world's largest mill museum. Built into the ruins of what was once the world's largest flourmill, **Mill City Museum** is located on the historic Mississippi Riverfront. Visitors of all ages will learn about the intertwined histories of the flour industry. In addition, the city was the leader of the country's mill industry in 19th century. Its yearly flour production can bake more than 12 million of breads every day. After the tour to the mill museum, we will ascend to the top of the museum to view Mississippi River and the trace of wall after the flour explosion.

Next, we will go to the largest shopping center in America- **Mall of America**. Mall of America is actually the national largest shopping and has a comprehensive entertainment center, and its size can accommodate two Pyramids of Khufu. The amusement park also includes a movie theater with a 14 inches giant screen, an underwater exploration world with 1.2 million metric tons of water, a two-story golf course with 18 golf holes. Day 3: Ginseng Farm – Hincheley's Dairy Farm
