Itinerary

Chicago- Springfield, Illinois

Day 1 Hotel : Ramada Inn or equivalent

U.S. Route 66 (US 66 or Route 66) nicknamed the Mother Road was one of the original highways within the U.S. Highway System. The highway began from Chicago and ran all the way to Santa Monica, California, covering a total of 2,448 miles (3,940 km). We will first visit the crossing of Adams Street and Michigan Avenue, which is the starting point of Route 66. Then we will visit Pontiac, another important destination on Route 66. We will have a guided museum tour through which you can have a comprehensive understanding of the Mother Road. The tour will be guided by the city staff and includes

Route 66 Hall of Fame (the largest collection of Route 66 Memorabilia in Illinois), the Pontiac Oakland Automobile Museum (one of the world's greatest and most expansive collections of Pontiac) and the Museum of the Gilding Arts (store signs on Route 66 used to be made of gold! Here you can also learn how to make gold leaf). Then we will go south to Springfield, hometown of Abraham Lincoln, one of the most respected presidents in the United States. We will see his former home where Lincoln lived in for 17 years. Right behind his residence, there is the State Capitol of Illinois, the tallest non-skyscraper capitol building in the United States.

St. Louis – Tulsa

Day 2 Hotel : Ramada Inn or equivalent

In the morning, we will head for St. Louis, the largest metropolitan area of East Missouri. The city sits by the banks of Mississippi River, the longest river of the country. Located in Central America, St. Louis is right at the geographical center point of the United States. It used to be one of the busiest train transport hubs in the world. It held the 3rd Summer Olympics in 1904. It is also well known for being the beginning point of the Westward Movement. Visit the Gateway Arch, a 630-foot monument, is the world's tallest arch, commemorating the striving men during this historical migration and land expansion. Right next to the Arch, it's the beautiful old Cathedral built in 1834. Then we will visit the Forest Park, the most important recreation park for local people. The Missouri History Museum, Saint Louis Zoo, Saint Louis Art Museum, Saint Louis Science Center etc. are all located in the park and are all free to public. We will then head west towards Oklahoma City. You will find architectures built in early age of Route 66, such as gas stations built like private homes so travelers feel warm and cozy when they see it. We will also pass Coleman Theatre, one of the largest theatres in Central US and provided a lot of entertainment for travelers. It was built 1929 and remains a significant architecture today. We will arrive in Tulsa in the evening.

Oklahoma City - Fort Worth

Hotel : Radisson Hotel Fort Worth or equivalent

In the morning, we will visit Tulsa, a city boomed by oil exploitation at the end of 19th century. The local tycoon Wait Philips built an Italian-renaissance style mansion after earning huge fortune. The mansion and its garden are now changed into an art museum. The collection includes art works from Picasso and many other famous artists. Its garden itself is a must see as well. When we come to the west, don't forget to learn about western culture, often connected with cowboys. When we reach Oklahoma City, we will visit the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum. Here you will learn a lot of knowledge and interesting facts about cowboys and life in the west. A real-size western town is even built inside the museum for you to have direct experience. For lunch, we will go to the Vietnam town in Oklahoma City. Many Vietnamese refugees settled here in 1970s. As time goes by, a lot more immigrants from Southeast

Asia moved here as well. There are numerous Asian restaurants that even beat those in their homeland. .

Then we will head to Fort Worth, visit The Historic Stockyard. Once home to cowboys, cattlemen and outlaws, today the Stockyards National Historic District is one of the most popular attractions in Texas. Day and night, visitors come to the Stockyards to get a taste of the true American West. Our guide will arrange a free time for guests to walk around. After diner, we will enjoy the Stockyards Championship Rodeo, the two hours Stockyards Championship Rodeo maintains a strong commitment to visitors looking

for an authentic Western Cowboy Experience. The show features bull riding, tie down roping, team roping, barrel racing, bronc riding and break away roping.

Dallas- Houston

Hotel : Crowne Plaza Near Sugar Land or equivalent

Enjoy your breakfast before we start the tour!

We will follow the path of history to George W Bush Presidential Library. The mission of the George Bush Presidential Library and Museum is to preserve and make available for research the official records, personal papers, and artifacts of President George H.W. Bush, to support democracy, promote civic education, and increase historical understanding of U.S. national experience through the life and times of George Bush.

After lunch, we will go for the Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza. The museum examines the life, times, death, and legacy of President John F. Kennedy, and is located at the very spot from which Lee Harvey Oswald, according to four government investigations, shot and killed the President on November 22, 1963. Besides, we will get to the Pioneer Plaza, largest bronze sculpture garden in Dallas.

Day 3 Houston In-depth Tour (Gulf of Mexico – NASA) Hotel :

Enjoy your breakfast before we start the tour!

We will make our first stop to Battleship Texas, took part in some of the most significant naval battles of the 20th century during both world wars. Now docked along the Houston Ship Channel, she serves as a memorial to those turbulent times. Then go for San Jacinto Monument, the world's tallest masonry column. It commemorates the decisive battle of the Texas Revolution. Led by General Sam Houston, the Texan Army engaged and defeated General Antonio López de Santa Anna's Mexican army in a fight that lasted just 18 minutes. The monument is 567 feet tall and 17 feet higher than Washington Monument in DC, topped with a Lone Star – the symbol of Texas. The most important part of the day is NASA Space Center.

Dolphin Cruise in Golf of Mexico, we bring you up close to view the dolphins in their natural habitat.

We will go to the Space Center for Tram tour to Rocket Park, see the control center, astronaut training center, space shuttle. The center features more than 400 space artifacts, permanent and traveling exhibits, attractions and theaters related to the exciting future and

remarkable past of America's human space-flight program.
