### **Day 1 New York City in-depth Tour**

**Wall St – liberty cruise – USS Intrepid –Times Square - MoMA – Fifth Ave (150mins) – Central Park (Lady M cake taste)**

At a first glance, travelling around the entire of New York City seems like the mission impossible; however, our highly organized tour is especially designed for you to feel the core spirit of the New York, by visiting amounts of famous landmarks and museums to learn more of its unique history, and shopping in the world top-brand boutiques! Start from the world famous financial and securities trading center – **Wall Street**, taking pictures with the symbol of New York Stock Exchange - Charging Bull. Guests will have a chance to take a **sightseeing cruise** on the Hudson River to enjoy the city from a totally different view, as well as take pictures with the backdrops of Statue of Liberty and Brooklyn Bridge. In addition, **USS INTREPID**, the national heritage that costs \$120 million, is reopening for visitors. Concorde supersonic airliner and a variety of aircrafts will be all in the exhibition for the guests to visit. Later we will visit **MoMA**, it has been important in developing and collecting modernist art, and is often identified as one of the largest and most influential museums of modern art in the world. Or you can go to **the fifth avenue**, also the heart of Midtown, enjoy luxury shopping experience. Stroll around **Central park** which is the most visited urban park in the United States, and take a break to taste Lady M, one of the most popular handmade cakes! Our tour bus will take guests to “World Crossroads”, **Times Square**. It got its name from the New York Times building. You will see the most crowded and most prosperous business blocks in the world. You can also go to Ripley’s Believe It or Not. It is one of the most entertaining museums in the world.

### **Day 2 New York City Tour**

**WTC & Ground Zero (3 hours) – United Nations Headquarter (guide tour into the Hall) - Metropolitan Museum (150mins)**

In the morning, we will visit the **One World Observatory**. One World Trade Center, as the icon of New York, is located at the southwest most of Manhattan, is the highest skyscraper in New York and America, at same time, it is ranked No.4 in the world with the height of 1,776ft. This number is exactly same as the year of the Declaration of Independence post. Upon entry, Guests are greeted in the Global Welcome Center, where a large video board features salutations in an array of languages, and a dynamically generated world map highlights the hometowns of visitors. After, guests will have chance to experience a program titled “Voices,” which tells the personal stories of the men and women who built One World Trade Center. Next, “Foundations” provides Guests with a close up view of the very bedrock on which the building stands. Start by ascending to the top of the tallest building in the Western Hemisphere in less than sixty seconds, guests could then look out the horizon and feel the city’s invincible spirit.

Next we can visit the **911 Memorial & Museum**. Here, the Memorial’s twin reflecting pools are each nearly an acre in size and feature the largest manmade waterfalls in the North America. The pools sit within the footprints where the Twin Towers once stood with the 3000 names of the people who died in the 911 terrorist attacks. The National September 11 Memorial Museum serves as the country's principal institution concerned with exploring the implications of the events of 9/11, documenting the impact of those events and exploring 911’s continuing significance.

Then, let's take a look and visit **Oculus**. With an additional 290,000 square feet of exciting, multi-level retail and dining space, the World Trade Center site is the focal point of Lower Manhattan.

Of course, we will not miss the famous **Metropolitan Museum of Art** (150mins in-depth tour). The Metropolitan Museum of Art is the largest art museum in the United States with collections of more than 2 million works of art.

Lastly, we will visit **Headquarters of United Nations** The headquarters of the UN is a complex that has served as the official headquarters of the United Nations. Although it is situated in New York City, the land occupied by the United Nations Headquarters and the spaces of buildings that it rents are under the sole UN and not the U.S. government. We will visit Headquarter of United Nations **Lobby**(Government-issued photo identification is required to enter the United Nations. For security reasons, children under 5 years of age are not permitted on tour. If visiting is not available or the United Nations closes for certain reasons, we will visit outside of the UN and take pictures for memory.).. Into the night, **Broadway musicals** are one of the most celebrated symbols of the city. You will have a chance to watch the world admired Broadway shows upon your request. (Note: please book the tickets in advance since seats are limited. You can consult your tour guides for tickets and price.)

### **Day 3 New York – Philadelphia – Amish Village – Washington D.C.**

In the morning, we will visit Princeton University, one of the prestigious Ivy League universities in United States. A guided campus tour will give our guests the opportunity to know more about American education culture. Then we will head to the National Independence Historical Park in Philadelphia. While walking on the cobblestone streets, it seems that you could still hear the rings by the Liberty Bell, which has witnessed the founding history of America. Independence Hall (exterior, reverse side of \$100 bill), is the birthplace of American modern democracy, where the Declaration of the Independence and the Constitution was debated and adopted. Next we will go to the One Liberty Observation Deck, standing on the top of Philly and enjoy the stunning view of the first capital of US. In the afternoon, we will head to Washington D.C., and visit the Madame Tussands in Washington D.C. which is the only attraction you can get close to the “44 presidents” of US. We will have the chance to explore the inner structure of The White House, taking photographs with Oval Office desk aka The Resolute Desk. The great names will be memorized and honored forever. Next, we will visit the White House (exterior, reverse side of \$20 Bill). We will also visit the U.S. Department of Treasury (exterior, reverse side of \$10 Bill), Lincoln Memorial, Korean War Memorial and Vietnam War Memorial. Lincoln Memorial(reverse side of \$5 Bill) is built in recognition of the great efforts of President Abraham Lincoln for American human rights, and the famous speech “I Have a Dream” by Martin Luther King Jr. take place right outside Lincoln Memorial.(Due to effect of early sunset during winter time, we will visit Lincoln Memorial after dusk.)

### **Day 4 Washington D.C. Tour - Home**

**Summer schedule: apply when DC cruise resume.**

Depart from the hotel in early morning; we will first visit the US Capitol (reverse side of \$50 bill). The U.S. Capitol was established at 1793, it has become the symbol of American people and government. Our professional tour guide will bring you inside and have a look around the interior of the Capitol building (if the Capitol is closed, we will see the exterior of the Capitol building instead.) We will also visit the Library of Congress (exterior), which has served the

United States congress for more than 200 years, and Supreme Court of the United States (exterior). After that, we will take the D.C. Cruise along Potomac River to see many of the areas' most historic landmarks and memorials in a unique way. Along the way, you will see the Washington Monument, the World War II Memorial, the Thomas Jefferson Memorial and etc. We will also visit Newseum, a top 10 ranked popular attraction in Washington D.C. It's known as one of the most interactive museum in the world that promotes free expression and the First Amendment to the United States Constitution. The Newseum experience traces the evolution of electronic communication from the birth of radio, to the technologies of the present and the future. In the afternoon, the tour will go to DCA and come back to New York City.

**Winter schedule: apply when DC cruise close.**

The Newseum experience traces the evolution of electronic communication from the birth of radio, to the technologies of the present and the future. In the afternoon, the tour will go to DCA and come back to New York City.
