Itinerary

Day 1: New York-Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Virginia Beach

Departure from New York City in the morning, our tour begins by traveling through the beautiful scenery from the state of New York down to North Carolina. First, arrive at **Chesapeake Bay Bridge**, known as one of the Seven Engineering Wonders of the Modern World. It is a 23-mile (37 km) long fixed link crossing the mouth of the Chesapeake Bay and connecting the Delmarva Peninsula's Eastern Shore of Virginia with Virginia Beach and the metropolitan area of Hampton Roads, Virginia. Afterward, we will stop at the **Virginia Beach**. Festival fish, jumping dolphins, frolicking porpoise...all in bright, colored lights at the beach mark the official start of the holiday season along Virginia Beach. This unique light show has drawn more 25.000 families to visit each year, and it has been named one of the Southeast Tourism Society's "Top 20 November Events." Then we will reach North Carolina for night.

Day 2: South of the Borders (Carolina)-Georgia-Orlando, Florida

Continuing our tour down to the South on day 2, we will pass through South of the Border and Savannah, Georgia. **South of the Border** is a rest stop and roadside attraction between Dillon, South Carolina and Rowland, North Carolina. Its Mexican themed kitsch location has served as a rest stop for tourist traveling to and from Florida since 1950s. Its mascot is Pedro, an extravagantly stereotypical Mexican



bandito.

Savannah is the oldest city in the State of Georgia. Its' unique architecture and historic buildings have attracted millions of visitors. Its' beautiful scenery also can be seen from the movie "Forest Gum". Its' favorite stories involve the life of Florence Martus, who was known by Savannahinas and sailors of the sea as "the Waving Girl". Florence Martus took it upon herself to be the unofficial greeter of all ships that entered and left the Port of Savannah. At night we will arrive in Orlando, Florida.

Day 3: Disney Animal Kingdom or Epcot Center

On day 3, guests will enjoy a fun day visiting either Disney Animal Kingdom, or Epcot.

Disney's **Animal Kingdom** is the fourth of four theme parks built in Bay Lake, Florida, opened in 1998. Covering more than 500 acres, and is the first Disney theme park to be themed entirely around animal conservation. Animal Kingdom divided into 7 theme areas, which includes Oasis, Discovery Island, Expedition Everest, Kilimanjaro Safari...A ride on the Kilimanjaro Safari will give you a chance to see numerous African animals as they freely roam through the African Savannah.

Epcot, acronym for "the Experimental Prototype Community of Tomorrow", is a utopian community of the future. It consists of two themed areas: Future World and World Showcase. Future World includes many attractions to explore from Mission: SPACE to The Circle of Life and countless more with endless fun and learning possibilities. World Showcase, a large area reminiscent of a permanent world fair which containing 11 pavilions; each pavilion themed and dedicated to represent a specific country. At closing time, "Illuminations: Reflection of Earth" a show feature fireworks, lasers, water fountain will the place in the World Showcase lagoon.

Day 4: Disney's Magic Kingdom or Hollywood Studios

Enjoy an entire day at the theme park of your choice: either Magic Kingdom or Hollywood Studios.

See fantasy become a reality as we explore **Magic Kingdom**: African Adventure, Haunted Mansion, Hall of the President, Dream along with Mick, Snow White...and so on.

Disney Hollywood Studios, it is dedicated to show business, drawing inspiration from the heyday of Hollywood in the 1930s and 1940s. A visit to Hollywood Studios guest will discover how Disney famous characters are brought to life; Indian Jones Epic Stunt Spectacular demonstrates movie making magic...

Day 5: Universal Studios or Islands of Adventure

Universal Studios, combined film production studio and theme park. Visitors feel like they are in a move set with rides, shows, attractions inspired by popular film,



television shows.

The **Wizarding World of Harry Potter** forms part of Universal Parks and Resorts' **Islands of Adventure** theme park in Orlando. It is also one of the seven themed areas within the park. The area's flagship attraction is Harry Potter and the Forbidden Journey which exists within a re-creation of Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry. It takes riders on a journey through Harry Potter's wizarding world

Day 6: SeaWorld Orlando

SeaWorld Orlando, one of the most popular theme parks in the world. It has many lives shows and attractions including rides and animal exhibits, most famously for its Shamu Killer Whale Show.

Day 7: Daytona Beach and St. Augustine

Daytona Beach is a city in Volusia County, Florida. The city is historically known as having a beach where the hard packed sand allows motorized vehicles to drive on the beach in restricted areas. This hard packed sand made Daytona Beach a mecca for motorsports, with the old Daytona Beach Road Course having hosted races for over 50 years. This course was replaced in 1959 by the Daytona International Speedway. The city is also the headquarters for NASCAR and the Grand American Road Racing Association.

St. Augustine, founded in 1565 by Spanish explorer and admiral Pedro Menéndez de Avilés, it is the oldest continuously occupied European-established city and port in the continental United States. St. Augustine lies in a region of Florida known as "The First Coast", which extends from Amelia Island in the north to Jacksonville, St. Augustine, and Palm Coast in the south.

Day 8: Richmond, VA- National Christmas tree at the White House (Washington DC)-New York

We will visit **Richmond** which is the capital of the Commonwealth of Virginia. It has played an important role in the American Civil War and American Civil War. Beside of its modern skyscraper, it consist buildings/sites has historical significance: St.Johnn's Church, Jackson Ward, and White House of the Confederacy...

Every year since 1923, there has been a National Christmas Tree at the White House in Washington D.C. to celebrate the holiday season which we will be visiting. Afterward, heading back to New York City and will be arrive in the evening.
