## Itinerary

### Day 1 Home – Washington D.C.

Thanks for choosing your vacation with us; our professional tour guide will meet guests at the Passenger Waiting Area. (Complimentary pick-up service of Dulles airport is available between 9:00 AM and 22:00 PM. Guests might need to wait for other passengers. Paid pick-up service is available for 24 hours: \$120 for the first two passengers and \$10 for each additional person). In addition, an optional night tour (\$25/person, minimum 4 people) will be offered to the guests who arrive at the hotel before 5:00pm.

## **Day 2 Washington D.C. City Tour**

Leave hotel, we will firstly head to U.S. Capitol (**Inside tour - If the U.S. Capitol was closed, we would only take pictures from outside. U.S. Capitol is closed on Sunday.**) Next, we will visit the Lincoln Memorial. This grand monument overlooks the Reflecting Pool, the Washington Monument and the U.S. Capitol. Inside, the 19-foot marble statue of the 16th president is flanked by inscriptions of his Second Inaugural Address and the famous Gettysburg Address. We will also stop at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial and the Korean War Memorial. The two monuments honor members of the U.S. armed forces who fought in the wars. Later we can take photos with backdrops of the White House due to the visit limitation for the public. Afterwards, you surely don't want to miss the opportunity to take our exclusive DC cruise for sightseeing of the town along the Potomac River. In addition, along the way, you will see the Washington Monument, the World War II Memorial, the Thomas Jefferson Memorial and etc. You are also able to visit the Smithsonian Institution freely which includes a group of museums: Air and Space Museum, American Indian Museum, American History Museum, Portrait Gallery, African American History Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden, etc. In the evening, guests need to gather in front of Air and Space Museum and then will be taken to have dinner.

## **Day 3 Washington D.C. – Corning – Niagara Falls**

We will arrive at one of Fortune Global 500's headquarter, Corning, to visit the Museum of Glass, which is dedicated to the history, art, and science behind glassmaking. Its collection contains more than 45,000 objects, some of which date back millennia. Guests here will be invited to enjoy the Hot Glass Show which is performed by professional glass craftsmen. After lunch, we are going to see the renowned Niagara Falls. Overlooking American Fall, the Horseshoe Fall and the Bridal Veil Fall, you will be astounded by the deafening roar of the falls. Take the voyage on the famous "Maid of the Mist" which gets passengers as close as possible to the Niagara Falls! The Maid rides right into the mists thrown up by the roaring cascade as the Niagara River tumbles over the edge of the falls. (**When Maid of the Mist closed in winter, another fun awaits you when fit in the tour schedule – an exclusive JetBoat ride on the Niagara River which makes the tour unforgettable and refreshing by playing in the whitewater rapids. \*JetBoat tour will be closed under tough weather or river icy condition.**) You can also optionally watch a Niagara IMAX movie which chronicles more than 12,000 years of history and examines human interaction with the falls from ancient time through the people - like you - who come to see them today. Later you can choose either: A. to stay in the Falls Park for self-exploration till returning the hotel, or, B. to take Niagara Falls In-depth Tour (**Tour fee: \$25/person, including \$13 of the admission ticket**). This interesting and exciting tour includes two popular attractions: the magnificent natural wonder - Niagara Whirlpool State Park and the U.S. historic landmark - Old Fort Niagara. The Niagara Whirlpool's greatest depth is 125 feet. It is estimated the whirlpool formed approximately 4,200 years ago by the upstream erosion of the Niagara escarpment by Niagara River. Old Fort Niagara is a rich historic landmark; it spans more than 300 years. Its commanding presence on the great lake caused it to play a critical role in the French and Indian War, the American Revolution and the War of 1812. The gorgeous Lake Ontario lies behind the Fort. Upon the sunset, you will also watch a Thundering Water Cultural Show which is a sacred place for the local Native American people. This show uses dance as a storytelling medium through which to showcase the impact that the falls have had on native culture. (**The completeness of**

night view on certain summer evenings may be limited or not available due to late sunset time and US Federal Government regulations on driving hours.) Later we will go to the hotel when night falls.

#### **Day 4 Upstate New York – Boston**

We will cross the upstate New York and leave for Boston when you enjoy the magnificent view of the Erie Canal and mountains on our comfortable tour bus. In the afternoon, we will arrive in the city of Cambridge, MA and visit the Harvard University. Here, you will find Harvard's oldest campus and take pictures with the statue of John Harvard, known as the "Statue of Three Lies". Also, we have a chance to take pictures with the backdrop of MIT's main buildings. For the rest of our Boston city tour, we will pass by the old Trinity Cathedral, the Hancock Building, Boston Park, Swan Lake Park, Boston Athenaeum, Boston Public Library, and overlook the gold dome of State House to discover more of the cultural city! At dinner, you will be recommended with Boston's famous fresh lobsters feast - get excited!

#### **Day 5 Boston – Rhode Island**

In the morning, fun will begin as soon as you board the cruise ship and enjoy a breathtaking view of the Boston harbor. Later, we will go to the New England Aquarium. The New England Aquarium is distinguished by a four-story Giant Ocean Tank which features an underwater communications system and large windows to the ceiling, making visitors feel like being placed under the Caribbean sea with fabulous views of coral reef as well as hundreds of reef animals, including sea turtles, stingrays, eels and fish. In the meanwhile, you will also learn of treating and rehabilitating sea turtles here. The next stop is the old Quincy Market. The old Quincy Market is opportune for strolling through, or to get a taste of the historical ambience as well as to pick out souvenirs among the assorted merchants and artisans. The Market was also surrounded by dozens of restaurants for dining option with a variety of authentic cuisines, and absolutely, you cannot miss the famous New England clam chowder. In the afternoon, guests will be taken to the Breakers at Newport, Rhode Island. The 4-story waterfront building is not just one of the most famous, but is the largest and grandest of the several historical Newport properties. Many local tales will help present the splendid days of Vanderbilt's family in the past.

#### **Day 6 Yale University – The Fifth Avenue (Shopping)**

Guests will visit the campus of Yale University located in New Haven in the morning! It is the third oldest college with Gothic buildings and student dormitory. You will enjoy a brief stop at the famous Sterling Memorial Library, which was designed by James Gamble Rogers as the centerpiece of Yale's Gothic Revival campus. (In case tour areas closed due to school's schedule, campus tour will only take place in the public open area.)

After a few hours ride, our comfortable tour bus will bring you back to the heart of New York City – the Fifth Avenue, a world class shopping paradise with all the trendy brands and luxury boutiques you can name. A special stay at the nine-story Bloomingdale's flagship store, located in the 59th St., will provide you an extravagant shopping experience, plus, a 10% discount for our guests only\* (for majority of commodities)! No mood for shopping? Then how about ambling around in the Central Park or going to the Soho, see what's new in town? Into the night, Broadway musicals are one of the most celebrated symbols of the city. You will have a chance to watch the world admired Broadway shows upon your request. (Note: If you would like to watch a Broadway show on that night, please check the show opening

time at or after 7:00PM. The transport and ticket are at your own expense. You can book tickets from tour guide in advance since seats are limited.)

### **Day 7 New York – Home**

At a first glance, travelling around the entire of New York City seems like the mission impossible; however, our highly organized tour is especially designed for you to feel the core spirit of the New York, by visiting amounts of famous landmarks and museums to learn more of its unique history, and shopping in the world top-brand boutiques! By stepping up to the Empire State Building, guests could overlook the beautiful view of the central park and the entire of New York City. Empire State Building stood as the world's tallest building for nearly 40 years, and has been surpassed in late 1970. Its name is derived from the nickname for New York, the Empire State. Nowadays it is still the most famed landmark of the city of New York. Also, Guests will have a chance to take a sightseeing cruise on the Hudson River to enjoy the city from a totally different view, as well as take pictures with the backdrops of Statue of Liberty and Brooklyn Bridge. In addition, we will visit U.S.S INTREPID, the national heritage that costs \$120 million. Concorde supersonic airliner and a variety of aircrafts will be all in the exhibition for the guests to visit. Wander around the world's famous financial and securities trading center – Wall Street, taking pictures with New York Stock Exchange, Charging Bull, and Trinity Church...**If time allows, we will additionally visit Metropolitan museum of Art and Madame Tussauds in Times Square.**
