The gift and annual celebration honor the lasting friendship between the United States and Japan and the continued close relationship between the two countries. we will visit Lincoln Memorial, together with the Reflecting Pool, Vietnam Veterans Memorial and Korean War Veterans Memorial. We will also stop at the White House and the United States Capitol to take photos. Then we will take a cruise along the Potomac River that runs through the capital.

Day 3 Washington DC - Amish - Chicago

The Amish are a group of traditionalist Christian church fellowships, closely related to but distinct from Mennonite churches, with whom they share Swiss Anabaptist origins. The Amish are known for simple living, plain dress, and reluctance to adopt many conveniences of modern technology. the most traditional descendants of the Amish continue to speak Pennsylvania German, also known as

"Pennsylvania Dutch". However, a dialect of Swiss German predominates in some Old Order Amish communities, especially in the American state of Indiana. We will go through the Amish farms and learn how they live without the benefit of modern technology such as electricity, running water, telephone service and Internet
